The Peer Housing Support Project

The project model is one-to-one peer mentorship, in which a Peer (an individual who is recently housed through one of our partner organizations and who is also seeking support) is connected with a trained Peer Supporter (an individual who has experienced homelessness and has transitioned successfully from homelessness to stably-housed). Connecting with people of shared experience has been shown to foster hope, reduce power imbalance, and provide emotional support during the very real challenges that come with transitioning from the street or a shelter into housing. The project focuses on supporting people as they transition along the housing spectrum. It is Peer-driven and responsive to changing needs.

PEER SUPPORTER

Reporting to the Project Coordinator, the Peer Supporter will provide input to the development and design of the Peer Housing Support project.

Specific Accountabilities / Deliverables

- Attend regular project meetings;
- Contribute to and seek assistance on specific Peer challenges; share learnings and successes.
- Assist development of a Peer Training Program and other project deliverables.
