The Peer Housing Support Project

The project model is one-to-one peer mentorship, where a Peer (an individual who is newly housed through one of our partner organizations and who is also seeking support) is connected with a trained Peer Supporter (an individual who has experienced homelessness and has transitioned successfully from homelessness to stable housing). Connecting with people of shared experience has been shown to foster hope, reduce power imbalances, and provide emotional support during the very real challenges that come with transitioning from the street or a shelter into housing. The project has a targeted focus on supporting people as they transition out of homelessness and along the housing spectrum. It is Peer-led and responsive to changing needs.

THE PEER HOUSING SUPPORTER

The Peer Housing Supporter reports directly to the Community Development Manager and is directly supervised by the Project Coordinator. In the pilot phase, we need people who can both provide peer support and reflect constructively on the design of the program and the training.

Specific Accountabilities / Deliverables

- Attend regular project meetings
- Contribute to and seek assistance on specific Peer challenges; share learnings and successes
- Provide feedback on the project design and delivery
- Successfully complete the required training program
- Provide one-on-one support consistent with the required training and the program framework to those transitioning from homelessness along the housing spectrum

Qualifications:

- Experience with and knowledge of the Greater Victoria housing and service providers community.
- A clear criminal record check
- Successfully living in a home for a stable period of time and in a positive place with their recovery
